CITY COUNCIL REGULAR MEETING MINUTES

January 23, 2023 6:00 P.M.

CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL OF MEMBERS:

Mayor Morris Called the meeting to order at 6:00 pm.

With a quorum of Council Members present, Mayor Morris called the meeting to order followed by the pledge of allegiance to the U.S. and Texas flags.

Kaylynn Williford - 16714 Marina Drive; Came before council with a proposal to help our community by adding No Parking Signs along Bob Smith, starting at the bird sanctuary, and ending at the end of Bob Smith. Wouldn't interfere with seeing the sun sets or having mowers come in and mow along Bob Smith. The goal is to prevent people from coming into our community, nonresidents from fishing and disturbing the marsh lands, leaving trash and debris. "I joined the JBIC homeowners association to help improve the community and get involved". Ginger Jones - 16612 Curlew; Voiced concerns about the possibility of raising residents water rates again and wanted to see what other communities are paying currently, and is there a reason why we need to raise the rates. Reminded everyone to come out and vote in April. Andrea Spearing - by phone - 16617 Jamaica Beach Road; Couldn't hear the meeting, and wanted to know why and please address the issue and correct it. Thanked council for being able to address and speak at council meetings by phone, thanked the Chief of Police for his report that's in the council packet, it has important information for citizens, thanked Director of Operations Quintero for his report and removing the sand on Buccaneer and restriping the road on Buccaneer, beach side. Would like to see a four way stop sign installed at Buccaneer and Jamaica Beach Road, to protect both pedestrians, golf carts and vehicles for entering the beach.

COMMENTS / REPORTS FROM MEMBERS OF COUNCIL:

Alderwoman Jones: Read her report, as follows:

I attended the West Galveston Island Property Owners Association and talked with my friend and our Texas State Representative Terri Leo Wilson. There were Texas Marshalls, Sheriffs, Constables, and Galveston's Chief of Police also there. It was a sea of Officers. Most of you know that my passion is to share our Stars for Troops with our 1stResponders. Jerry Mohn, the Chairman of WGIPOA allowed me to share a brief statement about Stars for Troops. I was able to talk to the entire group about our mission and asked for flags to be donated and dropped off at City Hall. As always, it was well received. I was able to share a lot of stars that day and met some very fine men in uniform. The video is on FaceBook in my group: Jamaica Beach Reporters and on Youtube.

I wanted more clarification about increasing our Reserves from 18 to 30. I made an appointment with Chief Garivey and took a friend with me, Debra Tabbert. Many of our questions could be answered in the Jamaica Beach Police Department Standard of Operations. I asked for a copy of it. Chief Garivey explained per the Mayor, the Department Standard of Operations could be obtained with an Open Record Request. Our discussion was very helpful. Thank you, Chief for taking the time to explain and clarify several of our questions.

Debbie, I have an ORR for you,

As I do every year, I went to the Galveston Courthouse and got Voter Registration Cards. I will be leaving some with the City Secretary here at City Hall and I will have a few available with me too. If you would like to register to vote for the next city election you will need to do that before April 5th.

We currently have 764 registered voters in Jamaica Beach.

Three seats are up for election this year, my seat, Gil Madray's seat, and the Mayor's seat. Alderman Madray – "Let's considering having two meetings a month again. Director of Operations Quintero asked me to look over our current building permit fees, and schedules, which I have, I also visited with Nola, she is very helpful and knowable on all the building permits and requirements, we discussed the ones to consider increasing and also increasing fees for inspections, I gave the information back to Robert. I attended the JBIC meeting, last week, it was a very good meeting, they have a lot of good things going on, working to clean up different areas in the city, as well as the beautification committee, all working together in the best interest of the City, everybody working together".

MPT Rupertus - Skipping his report until next month, will be giving a detailed report on the cities standings with projects that have been completed and projects still going on. "The main issues we're having currently in the city is with our water supply, we will be discussing that as well at a later date. Alderman Welch – "Huge thank you to all the volunteers at the park, they did a wonderful job, and Mr. Mayor, just a comment, would we consider having semi-monthly meeting again".

Alderman Green: - Hoped everyone had a good holiday season and hope it doesn't rain too much tomorrow.

Rupertus & Quintero After much discussion, Mayor Morris stated that the city has very serious problems with infrastructure, and it needs much needed repairs in our city, and asked "how do we speed the process up to take care of these problems, we operate on a very small budget and these things we need are very expensive items, do we take out a bond, raise property taxes, raise water rates, increase trash rates or possible adding a drainage fee for a few years to help with the extreme cost of water related issues, and where to find funds to pay for the issues". This item was tabled for future workshops and meetings.

MAYOR'S REPORT:

Mayor Morris reported he is working with Tiki Island to hire jointly a building inspector, "we hired a code enforcement office to help with some of the issues we currently have in the city". Thanked the beautification team for doing a great job. Will continue updating Ordinances, building fees, collaborating with the police department and municipal Judge on updating court fines. Still working on restriping the roads, making pedestrian walkways from Buccaneer to the beach, waiting on templates to finish striping other areas. "I will be doing a state of the city next month during our business meeting".
