## Emergency Services Donation on Water Bill

Water Bill Donation hasn't been increased since it's inception (circa 1988)

The Fire Department is 100% volunteer and operates 100% off private donations for all it's operating budget (maintenance, insurance, training, equipment, supplies, etc.)

Cost to outfit a Firefighter (Bunker Gear, Boots, etc) has doubled over the past 10 years to more than \$10,000 per firefighter

Cost of Medical supplies has quadrupled over the past 4 years and the cost of consumables has increased (Narcan, Epinephrine, other drugs with expiration dates)

Call volume has doubled over the last 15 years, with largest increase in medical calls (Average 60-70% of calls)

Maintenance costs have increased as supply chain issues have arisen since the pandemic

Grant opportunities have become increasingly difficult as the demographics of the city have changed from a small village to a resort destination

Cost of training has doubled and additional coursework has been added to deal with evolving hazards (e.g. Electrical Vehicles)

Insurance costs (Vehicle, D&O, Property, Malpractice, Worker's Comp, etc.) have all seen increases
